HOW I GOT HERE!

My interest in spiders was *inspired* by my irrational fear of them as a child. I managed that fear by studying them.

While a Museum technician I studied for a Bachelor of Science in Zoology at university, and then pursued a PhD in Spider Taxonomy. I was awarded a CSIRO Postdoctoral Fellowship during which I worked at the American Museum of Natural History (New York), and at the Australian National Insect Collection, Canberra before returning to Queensland Museum.

Having never visited a museum until the "tender" age of 21, I have now spent the last 33 years in and out of one!



WHAT I AM WORKING ON!

I provide a spider identification service, especially on bites, to the general public, hospitals and physicians.

I present talks to medical groups, conferences, and state-wide hospitals through video hook-ups, and have been appointed Spider Bite Consultant to Royal Brisbane Hospital.

My work with Public Health issues has assisted bite management, especially from White-tailed and Redback Spiders and their infestations.

At present, I am working on Australian Tarantulas and Racing Stripe Spiders (family *Miturgidae*). I am a world authority on Tarantula and Trapdoor Spiders and I have described new species world-wide, including 300+ new Australian species.
